#### WALK SAFELY TO SCHOOL DAY

#### National Walk Safely to School Day (WSTSD) is on Friday 17 May 2019.

Walk Safely to School Day is a community initiative that aims to raise awareness of the health, road safety, transport and environmental benefits that regular walking (especially to and from school) can provide for the long term wellbeing of our children. Apart from the physical benefits, regular walking also has a favourable impact on their cognitive and academic performance.

The annual event, now celebrating its 20th anniversary, encourages primary school aged children to build walking into their daily routine, by walking to and from school, not just on Friday 17 May, but every day.

The national initiative also promotes the vitally important road safety message: "Until they are 10, children must always hold the hand of an adult when crossing the road".

Here are the top 5 tips for parents to get their kids walking to school:

- 1. Walk some or if you can, walk all the way to school
- 2. Get off the bus, train, or tram a few stops earlier and walk the rest of the way
- 3. Leave the car at least 1 km away from school and walk the rest of the way
- 4. Set your alarm 30 minutes earlier to fit in a walk to school
- 5. If you can't walk in the morning, walk home after school
